The Valley of Amazement, Amy Tan

Amy Tan's *The Valley of Amazement* explores the world of Shanghai courtesans and as such is geared more towards adult readers. It opens in 1905, as a stunningly self-assured seven-year-old named Violet Minturn bursts on to the page.

"When I was seven, I knew exactly who I was: a thoroughly American girl in race and manners ... whose mother ... owned a first-class courtesan house in Shanghai."

The precocious Violet is in for a rude awakening.

This is a world in which women are sold and their names changed to suit the whim of whoever owns them. Violet's life as a woman leaves her totally vulnerable to exploitation. Her experiences, determination and travails give you an insight into another world, a microcosm of China in the early 20th Century; but the plight of women in this era, as in earlier ones, was similar across cultures. *The Valley of Amazement* also resurrects pivotal episodes in history: the collapse of China's last imperial dynasty; the rise of the Republic and the explosive growth of lucrative foreign trade and anti-foreign sentiment.

Her writing in this novel is a little laboured and at times, verges on melodrama, but is still a very interesting narrative.

Amy Tan has made her name with novels such as *The Joy Luck Club* (1987) and *The Bonesetter's Daughter* (2000), both excellent novels.


