#### **Cybersafety Help Button**

The Cybersafety Help Button is an application that can sit on a computer screen or can be minimised to sit on the task bar. When clicked, the Help Button takes the user to a web page that provides information and assistance to deal with cyberbullying, unwanted contact and offensive or illegal content. The page is divided into three functions — talk, report and learn.


The **talk** function is for users who are experiencing cyberbullying or who perhaps encountered something that has made them feel uncomfortable or threatened. It has a direct link to Kids Helpline resources where people can talk to a professional counsellor.

By clicking the **report** function, users can click through directly to site-specific cybersafety information on participating social networking and online game sites, or report abuse experienced on that site. Users can also access links to report scams or fraud, to report inappropriate content to the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) and to report improper contact or behaviour to the Australian Federal Police (AFP).

The **learn** function provides access to cybersafety and security education resources via the Stay Smart Online website and the ACMA's Cybersmart site.
